Russian Minor Program

Russian is one of the main languages in the world. It is used not only in Russia, but throughout Eastern Europe and in many Third World countries. Knowledge of Russian opens the way to numerous career options in education, government, and business. There is a real demand for people with proficiency in Russian since many fewer study this language. Beyond its practical value, the study of Russian is an enriching experience, introducing us to one of the major cultures of the world.

Placement Policy: Native and/or bilingual speakers of Russian may not receive credit for First-Year or Second-Year Russian. Other students who believe they are qualified to begin at a level higher than Rus 111 (first term, first year) are encouraged to contact a Russian Advisor about appropriate placement.

Requirements: 30 hours (12 hours lower division, 18 hours upper division)

Rus 211, 212, 213, Second-Year Russian	12 hrs
Rus 311, 312, 313, Third-Year Russian	9 hrs
Rus 233, Russian Culture (counts for upper division)	3 hrs
Upper-division electives (to be approved by Russian advisor)	6 hrs
Courses must be completed with a grade of C- or above. Grading option of S/U is permitted. A minimum of two upper-division courses must be completed at OSU in Corvallis.	

You may officially declare a minor at OSU by completing a Declaration of Minor form with the Registrar's Office and with the Department of Foreign Languages & Literatures.
